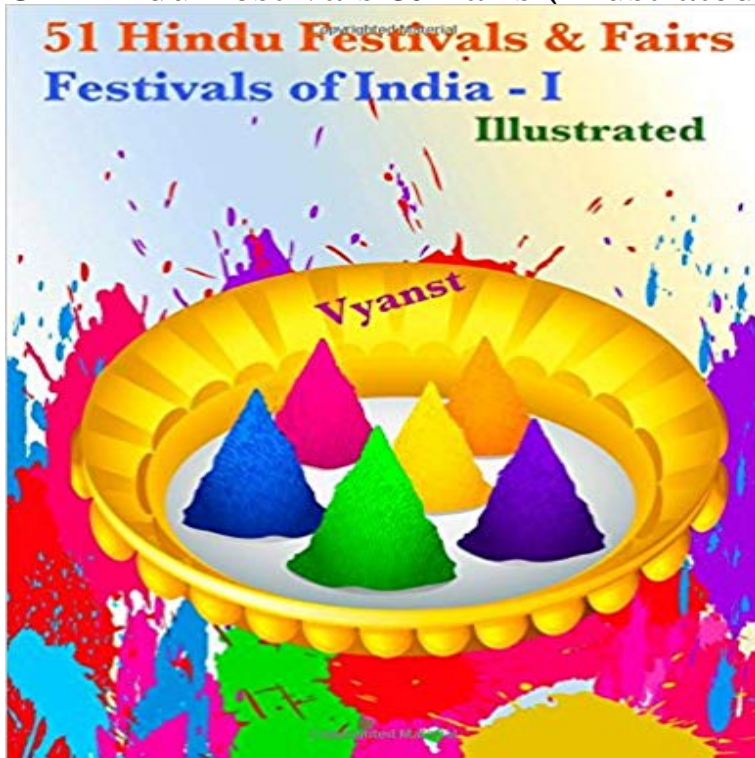


51 Hindu Festivals & Fairs (Illustrated) (Festivals of India) (Volume 1)
