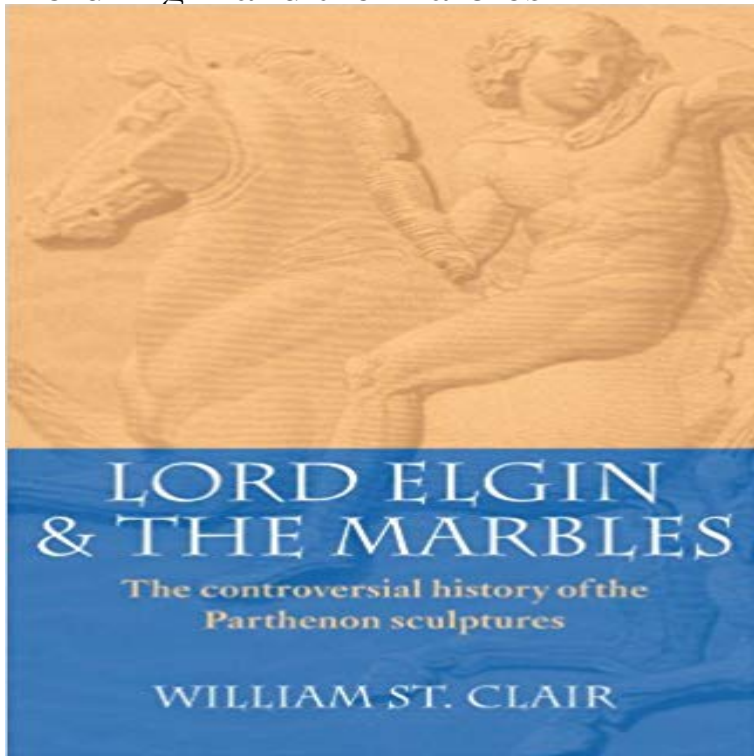


Lord Elgin and the Marbles
