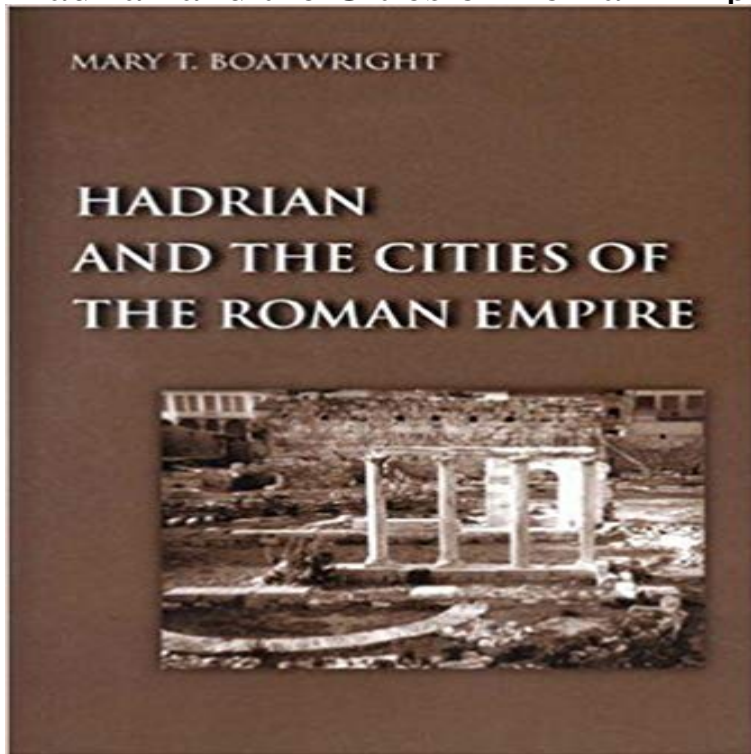


Hadrian and the Cities of Roman Empire

Mary Boatwright traces the marks that Hadrian left on over 130 cities, demonstrated by the large number of inscriptions that are dedicated to him. Chapters discuss existing cities and brand new cities that show Hadrian's influence, the results of his patronage, governance and economy of cities and his personal interaction with a large part of the empire.
