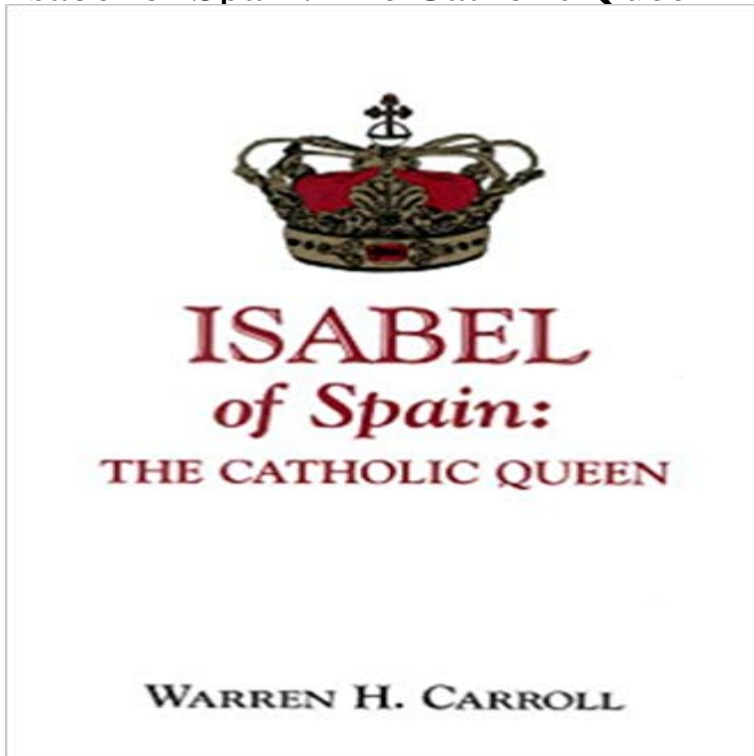


Isabel of Spain: The Catholic Queen
