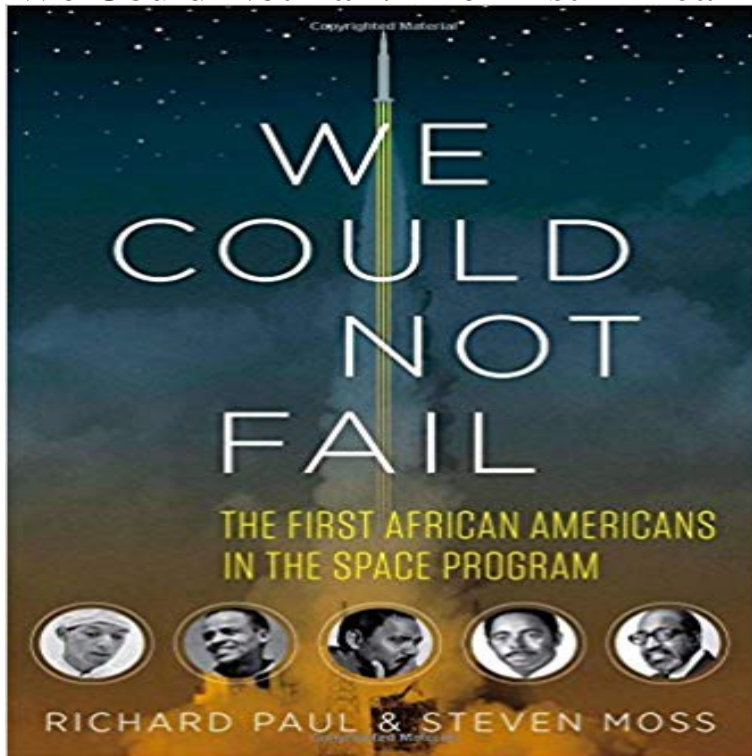


We Could Not Fail: The First African Americans in the Space Program
